# MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

No one could have foreseen a year like 2020. Our hearts go out to all who have suffered and those who have lost loved ones since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.

For an animal welfare charity like SCARS, the start of the pandemic presented a dual challenge. Reduced access to the communities we serve impacted our spay-neuter-return program and led to more unwanted pets. At the same time, our revenue was dropping with the cancellation of in-person events. In response, our volunteers eagerly developed new skills as we pivoted to online fundraising. These new skills will serve us well in the future.

In September, the number of animals needing to come into care suddenly doubled and that trend continued. At one point, we temporarily closed intake. Our revenue was not keeping up with the volume of intake and we couldn't allow the welfare of animals already in care to be impacted. We put out a plea for help and our supporters stepped up in a BIG way to make sure our work continued.

In the end, 2020 was like a roller coaster of ups and downs. We are so grateful to our volunteers and the supporters who made it possible to be there for animals who desperately needed help.

## INTAKE



SCARS helped 2,211 animals (1,018 dogs and 1,193 cats) during 2020. This was an increase of 51% from 2019 (or 747 animals).

We worked closely with participating communities such as Westlock County, Athabasca County, Edmonton and area, Leduc County, Wabasca (MD of Opportunity), Bigstone Cree Nation, Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement and Beaver Lake Cree Nation. Wabasca, Bigstone, Buffalo Lake, Beaver Lake, and Onion Lake were also part of our Spay-Neuter-Return and Walls for Winter Programs.

We also assisted with strays and owner surrenders from Frog Lake, Fishing Lake and Saddle Lake. We also offered these communities spay/neuter assistance help on request. Wabasca and Bigstone have their own pounds. We assisted by taking all the unwanted dogs and cats that came into these facilities.

Though the communities mentioned are our priority, we helped in other communities when needed. We continued to accept owner surrender animals that were previously adopted through SCARS. We constantly responded to emergency situations!







## OUTCOME

SCARS provided humane outcomes for 2,260 animals (1,056 dogs and 1,204 cats) during 2020. Our adoptions increased 52% from 2019 with an additional 628 animals being adopted.

We saw a significant increase in adoptions this year. With people spending more time at home due to the pandemic, many decided it was a good time to add pets to their families. When we didn't have available space for intakes, we transferred pets to partner organizations.

Out of 126 SNR's, we returned 115 and pet owners requested that 11 pets be put up for adoption.

A small percentage of the animals we bring into care cannot be saved. We take comfort in knowing they receive loving care and are provided with a humane end of life where that is the kindest option.

## SPAY-NEUTER-RETURN AND WALLS 4 WINTER

- Our total SNRs completed was 126, a decrease of 20% from 2019.
- For several months, there was NO access into areas we normally assist.
- Reduced community access meant fewer deliveries of pet shelters.
- Veterinary clinics limited the number of spay-neuter appointments we could book. This was due to pandemic protocols and increased demand for their services from the general public.



## RESCUE STORIES

Meet Sandy and Solo. During November 2020, a kind man directed us to the spot where a new mom had given birth. We found her with one live puppy (Solo) and one that was already deceased.







In March 2020, we got a call about Bubba. He had been on the receiving end of a brutal attack. We are so glad we were able to help him.
